# Ensamplario Atlantio III

#### Introduction

You are viewing the follow-on to my two *Ensamplario Atlantio* volumes. It is my latest installment of material suitable for linear and unit-based countwork embroidery. I continue to doodle fills, strips, borders, yokes, and all-over designs in the hope that folk are still looking for fodder suitable for the various styles of blackwork and strapwork embroidery.

With a few exceptions (so noted on the pages where they appear) the designs in this book are all my own creations and bear asterisks next to their item numbers to so indicate. Items without asterisks are my adaptations and interpretations of blackwork fills appearing on historical artifacts, and as such are accompanied by source annotations on the bottom of the page on which they appear.

As a whole, I present these charts as a historically inspired but modern collection. If you are looking for fully annotated patterns drawn from actual artifacts, you are cordially redirected to my The New Carolingian Modelbook, and The Second Carolingian Modelbook.

Readers will note that some designs here are presented with the background partially shaded. I do that to suggest their suitability for voided work, where the background is filled in with long armed cross stitch or other suitable techniques.

For additional information I refer the reader to my earlier works for essays on pattern uses, working methods, materials, and context.

# THY Ensamplatio Atlantio?

The New Carolingian Modelbook: Counted Embroidery Patterns from Before 1600 and the sequel The Second Carolingian Modelbook were named in honor of my once and now present home in the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA) – the Barony of Carolingia (Eastern Massachusetts). But while I was working on first volume I had removed to another SCA district, part of the Kingdom of Atlantia (Roughly the US Seaboard region from Maryland to South Carolina). At that time, I promised to name my next book accordingly: Ensamplario Atlantio.

This is my third offering in this. While contents here continue the tradition of the two *Ensamplario* books, I go further afield in this one, into borders, corners, yokes, all-over designs and spot motifs in addition to fills for inhabited blackwork. I also add designs that are blatantly modern or fantastic, with little or no footing in traditional patterns. As you work these patterns, I hope that I have enticed your needle to wander off on a journey of fantasy and high adventure. I thank you for riding along.

May these designs inform your creativity and fill your hours with joy.






21.1 - The center point on the peacock's crown is formed by half-stitches on the diagonal









24.1b - Horses can be turned into unicorns by adding the five stitches of the horn. Note that the two shown in red are worked over 2x1 units, something I rarely do.





